



QA: If Everyone Came from One Family, How Is There "Racism"?

QUESTION: If everyone on the face of the earth came from a first family, then how can anyone be "racist"?

ANSWER: Evolution is the purest "racist" doctrine that has been taught. It is the government-sponsored explanation of Creation without God, and it has no science or Scripture to support its wild, mythological claims!

1. **Interestingly, as scientific facts have been unearthed**, Evolutionists named the first DNA-giver as a female named "**Eve**." Late studies of Mitochondrial DNA (mtDNA) in the late 1980's and early 1990's, nicknamed the "**Eve theory**," showed that there must have been a common human parent from which humans came. Since there is no genetic recombination (males make no contribution of mtDNA to the fetus), then all mtDNA comes from mothers through their daughters, so then all humans had to have come from a first mother. This establishes the Bible fact in **Genesis**:

And Adam called his wife's name Eve, because she was the mother of all living. (**Genesis 3:20**)

2. **Jesus Christ Believed Bible Facts:**

a. **Matthew 19:3-6, 8:**

The Pharisees also came to Him, testing Him, and saying to Him, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife for just any reason?"

And He answered and said to them, "Have you not read that He who made them at the beginning 'made them male and female,' [*not their names, but by gender mentioned in **Genesis 1:27; 5:2, jtpII***] and said, 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh'? [*in only one place are these words found, **Genesis 2:24** and when it is quoted by Jesus, and **Ephesians 5:31, jtpII***] So then, they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let not man separate... He said to them, "Moses, because of the hardness of your hearts, permitted you to divorce your wives, but from the beginning it was not so." [*"the beginning" as recorded in **Genesis 2:19-23, jtpII***]

- b. In **Matthew 24:21; Mark 13:19**, Jesus' prophecy of the destruction of Jerusalem included "great tribulation" such as had not been experienced since "the beginning of the world" [referencing **Genesis 1-2**].

- c. In **John 8:44**, Jesus' basis for avoiding the Devil is to recognize his lack of morality "from the beginning," which means if the **Genesis 1-3** account isn't factually accurate, then Jesus gives no good reason to avoid the Devil!
