
Was Jesus Married?

released by Harvard University shows a


fourth century fragment of papyrus that

divinity professor Karen L. King says is the only existing ancient text that quotes Jesus explicitly referring to having a wife. King, an expert in the history of Christianity, says the text contains a dialogue in which Jesus refers to "my wife," whom he identified as Mary. King says the fragment of Coptic script

is a copy of a gospel, probably written in

Greek in the second century. /

Translated legible text

- not [to] me. My mother gave to me li[fe]
- The disciples said to Jesus
- 3. deny. Mary is worthy of it
- 4. Jesus said to them, "My wife"
- she will be able to be my disciple

To say the least, this fragment is Incomplete, Disconnected, Alone, and 3 Centuries too late to accurately represent any conversation of Jesus Christ on Earth!

"For to this you were called, because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that you should follow His steps" 1 Peter 2:21 "For if these things are yours and abound, you will be neither barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ" 2 Peter 1:8

The discovery could reignite the debate over:

1. Whether Jesus was married On Earth: "NO"

- Of all the many references to "wife" in Matthew- John, NOT ONCE did it refer to a wife of Jesus Christ!
- When Paul argued his "right" to have a wife, though he was unmarried himself, HE NEVER USED Jesus Christ for his example of having a wife!
- NO Manuscript representing 1st Century Scripture made any mention of Jesus having a "wife."

1. Whether Jesus was married

From Heaven: "YES"

"For I have betrothed you to one husband, that I may present you as a chaste virgin to Christ" 2 Corinthians 11:2

"Therefore, my brethren, you also have become dead to the law through the body of Christ, that you may be married to another--to Him who was raised from the dead, that we should bear fruit to God" Romans 7:4

The parallel between the husband and his wife and Christ and the church should not be ignored! Ephesians 5:22-32



The discovery could reignite the debate over:

2. Whether Mary Magdalene was His wife.

If she had been Jesus' wife, why did the Apostles NOT believe her report that He had, indeed, been raised from the dead?

Mark 16:9-11

If she had been Jesus' wife, why did she not recognize Him at the tomb, and why did she call Him "Rabboni" and not "Husband?"

John 20:14-16

3. Whether he had a female disciple.

"Certain women who had been healed" Luke 8:1-3
"Many women who followed Jesus from Galilee"
Matthew 27:55-56
