

"loses its flavor"—from Greek moros-dull, foolish, or without its purpose, can describing a Christian who may be crystalline sparkly on the outside, but without any use to the body of Christ

"good for nothing"—totally useless, having departed from its intended purpose

Lot's wife = "salt" in the sacrifice? Genesis 19:26;

Mosaic sacrifices all had salt Leviticus 2:13;

"Covenant of salt" Numbers 18:19;

Promised Land bordered on Salt Sea Numbers 34:3;

Salt dedicated water through Elisha 2 Kings 2:18-22;

Should NOT have "salty" language

Colossians 4:6; James 3:8-12

Matthew 5:13-7:12

Matthew 5:13: "You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled

underfoot by men."

"loses its flavor"—from Greek moros-dull, foolish, or without its purpose. It can describe a Christian who may be crystalline sparkly on the outside, but without any use to the body of Christ Being with some Christians leaves the day "flat" Job 6:6; Being with other Christians is like being born Ezekiel 16:4

"good for nothing"—totally useless, having departed from its intended purpose



14 "You are the light of the world.

A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden.

15 Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lampstand, and it gives light to all who are in the house.



Good-for-nothing salt = covered-up light!

"All who are in the house" = Everyone in our life!

# 2. CONTRAST Therefore, There Is Spiritual Growth In The Kingdom Matthew 5:13-7:12 A New Law

Matthew 5:17-20: "Do not think that I came to destroy the Law or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill. 18 For assuredly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one tittle will by no means pass from the law till all is fulfilled. 19 Whoever therefore breaks one of the least of these commandments, and teaches men so, shall be called least in the kingdom of heaven; but whoever does and teaches them, he shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven. 20 For I say to you, that unless your righteousness exceeds the righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven."

"Isaiah the prophet" - Matthew 1:22-23;

2:15; 4:14-17; 8:17; 12:17-21; 21:4

John 12:38; 13:18; 19:24

- 3. v. 19 He would teach Moses' commandments until His kingdom came Acts 1:1; Matthew 23:3
- 4. v.20 His kingdom was after the Scribes and Pharisees. 1 Kings 10:7; Matthew 23:1-5; 1 John 2:29

## 2. CONTRAST

**Anger Management - Matthew 5:21-26:** 

"You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder, and whoever murders will be in danger of the judgment.' 22 But I say to you that whoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment. And whoever says to his brother, 'Racal' shall be in danger of the council. But whoever says, 'You fool!' shall be in danger of hell fire. 23 Therefore if you bring your gift to the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, 24 leave your gift there before the altar, and go your way. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. 25 Agree with your adversary quickly, while you are on the way with him, lest your adversary deliver you to the judge, the judge hand you over to the officer, and you be thrown into prison. 26 Assuredly, I say to you, you will by no means get out of there till you have paid the last penny."

#### 2. CONTRAST

#### Action:

21"You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not murder [Genesis 9:6; Exodus 20:13; Deuteronomy 5:17], and whoever murders will be in danger of the judgment." [Deuteronomy 1:15-17; 16:19; Exodus 18:22-26]

Thought:

22 "But I say to you that whoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment.

[Deuteronomy 17:8-13] And whoever says to his brother, 'Raca!' shall be in danger of the council. [James3:8-10] But whoever says, 'You fool!' shall be in danger of hell fire." [Jeremiah 7:31-32]

Anger without cause = a desire for injury

Raca = Empty, no brains, contempt for thoughts

Fool = Dull, Stupid, hatred for heart or person

Any of these three expressions = MURDER! Mark 7:21; 1 John 3:15

#### Initiative:

23 Therefore if you bring your gift to the altar, and there remember that your brother has something against you, 24 leave your gift there before the altar, and go your way. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. 25 Agree with your adversary quickly, while you are on the way with him, lest your adversary deliver you to the judge, the judge hand you over to the officer, and you be thrown into prison. 26 Assuredly, I say to you, you will by no means get out of there till you have paid the last penny."

Matthew 5:27: "You have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not commit adultery."

Where was it "said?"

Moses' Law Exodus 20:14; Deuteronomy 5:18

Specifics-Leviticus 20:10

"Smarts"-Proverbs 6:32

Spiritual-Jeremiah 3:6-22; Hosea 3:1

Adultery Management #2- Matthew 5:27-32

#### Intent

#### Matthew 5:28

"But I say to you that whoever looks at a woman to lust for her has already committed adultery with her in his heart."

- 1. Doesn't apply to a Husband! 1 Corinthians 7:1-4
- 2. Why men? Proverbs 6:20-35;
- 3. Can become an "eyeful!" 2 Peter 2:12-14
- 4. Sage Advice-Proverbs 6:23-29; 2 Samuel 11:2-4
- 5. Emphasizes inward intent, not just outward action.

**Adultery Management #3 - Matthew 5:27-32** 

Intent Matthew 5:29-30

2. CONTRAST

"If your **right eye** causes you to sin, **pluck it out** and cast it from you; for it is more profitable for you that one of your members perish, than for your whole body to be cast into hell. **30** And if your **right hand** causes you to sin, **cut it off** and cast it from you; **for it is more profitable for you that one of your members perish, than for your whole body to be cast into hell."** 

- 1. Then is it all right to sin with your "left" hand?

  Matthew 6:1-4; 25:31-33, 41-45
- 1. NOT mutilation, but control of the body needed. Matthew 18:7-9; Mark 9:41-48; Romans 8:10-14
- 2. It is a continual struggle! Romans 7:18-25

**Intent** Matthew 5:31-32

"Furthermore it has been said, 'Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.' 32 But I say to you that whoever divorces his wife for any reason except sexual immorality causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a woman who is divorced commits adultery."

1. Where was it "said?"

**Deuteronomy 24:1-4** 

[NOT In "The Law;" Matthew 19:7-8]

2. Marriage is for life

Genesis 2:24; Romans 7:1-4

Adultery Management #5 - Matthew 5:27-32

"Furthermore it has been said, 'Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce.' 32 But I say to you that whoever divorces his wife for any reason except sexual immorality causes her to commit adultery; and whoever marries a woman who is divorced commits adultery."

- 3. The only exception is "sexual immorality." Matthew 19:3-12; 1 Corinthians 7:10-11 adultery is "an act" of this John 8:4
- 4. Divorce "for any reason" other than this is NOT acceptable!

"Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform your oaths to the Lord.' 34 But I say to you, do not swear at all: neither by heaven, for it is God's throne; 35 nor by the earth, for it is His footstool; nor by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. 36 Nor shall you swear by your head, because you cannot make one hair white or black. 37 But let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No.' For whatever is more than these is from the evil one."

Intent Matthew 5:33 "Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, 'You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform your oaths to the Lord.\"

1. Where was it "said?"

Exodus 20:7; Deuteronomy 5:11; 6:13; 10:20 Leviticus 19:12; Isaiah 48:1

2. What misapplication(s) had been made?

Isaiah 48:2-by Jerusalem;

Jeremiah 5:1-2; Hosea 4:15-16-by Heaven;

Jeremiah 7:8-10-use worship to "cancel"

false oaths

**Assurance Management #3 - Matthew 5:27-32** 

34 "But I say to you, do not swear at all neither by heaven, for it is God's throne;
35 nor by the earth, for it is His footstool; nor by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. 36 Nor shall you swear by your head, because you cannot make one hair white or black. 37 But let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No.' For whatever is more than these is from the evil one."

3. Is all "swearing" wrong?
Now it is! Matthew 5:34; James 5:12
Before, it wasn't! Genesis 21:22-24; 24:1-9;
Joshua 2:14-18; Ezra 10:5

**Assurance Management #4 - Matthew 5:27-32** 

**Intent** Matthew 5:34-37

34 "But I say to you, do not swear at all: neither by heaven, for it is God's throne; 35 nor by the earth, for it is His footstool; nor by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. 36 Nor shall you swear by your head, because you cannot make one hair white or black. 37 But let your 'Yes' be 'Yes,' and your 'No,' 'No.' For whatever is more than these is from the evil one."

4. Profanity (swearing falsely) is often accompanied by cursing Matthew 26:74 and disregard for God Jeremiah 7:8-11

Assurance Management #5 - Matthew 5:38-42

## Matthew 5:38-42:

"You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.' 39 But I tell you not to resist an evil person. But whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also. 40 If anyone wants to sue you and take away your tunic, let him have your cloak also. 41 And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two. 42 Give to him who asks you, and from him who wants to borrow from you do not turn away."

# 2. CONTRAST

**Assurance Management #6 -**

Matthew 5:38: "You have heard that it was said, 'An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth.'"

- 1. Where was it said?
  - A. Miscarriage-Exodus 21:22-27;
  - B. Scarring-Leviticus 24:17-22;
  - C. False Witness-Deuteronomy 19:14-21
- 2. It was the legal punishment for crimes to the person, NOT personal retaliation!

**Assurance Management #7 -**

Matthew 5:39: "But I tell you not to resist an evil person. But whoever slaps you on your right cheek, turn the other to him also."

- 1. Leave "getting even" to God Romans 12:19; Hebrews 10:28-31; Deuteronomy 32:35-36
- 2. This doesn't forbid renouncing evil-doers John 18:19-24; Acts 23:1-5
- 3. Wisdom is against retaliation Proverbs 20:22; 24:29

**Assurance Management #8 -**

Matthew 5:40: "If anyone wants to sue you and take away your tunic, let him have your cloak also."

- Which garment one is sued for is indifferent, because Luke 6:29 shows that it is a "package deal," that is, be willing to settle.
- 2. Especially if this involves a brother in Christ! 1 Corinthians 6:1-8
- 3. Remember Matthew 5:25?

**Assurance Management #9 -**

# Matthew 5:41: "And whoever compels you to go one mile, go with him two"

- 1. This is what happened to Simon of Cyrene Matthew 27:32; Mark 15:21
- 2. Jesus used this to show His Kingly authority Matthew 21:1-7; Zechariah 9:9

2. CONTRAST

**Assurance Management #10 -**

Matthew 5:42: "Give to him who asks you, and from him who wants to borrow from you do not turn away."

- 1. An Old Testament principle

  Deuteronomy 15:1-11
- 2. Now a New Testament principle Luke 6:29-36
- 3. NOT, however, indiscriminately so, but erring toward the merciful side.
- 4. God gives "according to His will"

  1 John 3:22

**Affection Management #1** 

Matthew 5:43-48: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.' 44 But I say to you, 'love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you, 45 that you may be sons of your Father in heaven; for He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust. 46 For if you love those who love you, what reward have you? Do not even the tax collectors do the same? 47 And if you greet your brethren only, what do you do more than others? Do not even the tax collectors do so? 48 Therefore you shall be perfect, just as your Father in heaven is perfect."

**Affection Management #2** 

Matthew 5:43: "You have heard that it was said, 'You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy.'

- 1. Where is the source of this quote?
  - a. NOT in Leviticus 19:18
  - b. BUT in Rabbinical "interpretations"
- 2. When uninspired people give their commentary, interpretation, or application of Scripture, it is not the same as Scripture saying something! Ecclesiastes 8:1

Jesus' teaches His point! Mark 4:33-34
OR Scripture makes its own point!
Matthew 9:10-13; 12:1-8

Spiritual Growth In The Kingdom Matthew 5:13-7:12

Matthew 5:44-45: But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you, 45 that you may be sons of your Father in heaven; for He makes His sun rise on the evil and on the good, and sends rain on the just and on the unjust."

- 1. Love is inclusive of "grace & mercy" or seeing their need for good in their misery
- 2. God sets the example every day that some good must be done regardless of others' attitudes toward us.

Matthew 5:46-48: "For if you love those who love you, what reward have you? Do not even the tax collectors do the same?

47 And if you greet your brethren only, what do you do more than others? Do not even the tax collectors do so? 48 Therefore you shall be perfect, just as your Father in heaven is perfect."

- 1. "Flat-lining" love is NOT acceptable!
- 2. "Perfection" is in consistentlyapplied attitude, not sinless actions! Luke 6:36; 1 Peter 1:15-16
- 3. It's NOT impossible! Ephesians 5:1-2

**Offering Spiritual Sacrifices** 

**Giving** 

**Matthew 6:1-4:** 

"Take heed that you do not do your charitable deeds before men, to be seen by them. Otherwise you have no reward from your Father in heaven. 2 Therefore, when you do a charitable deed, do not sound a trumpet before you as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets, that they may have glory from men. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. 3 But when you do a charitable deed, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, 4 that your charitable deed may be in secret; and your Father who sees in secret will Himself reward you openly.

2. CONTRAST

### Praying #1

### Matthew 6:5

5 "And when you pray, you shall not be like the hypocrites. For they love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the corners of the streets, that they may be seen by men. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward.

- 1. NOT hypocritically to "be seen by men."

  Matthew 23:5-7; Luke 20:46-47;

  Numbers 15:38-41-remember God, not man
- 2. NOT all "public prayers" are condemned! Luke 1:10; Acts 1:14; 2:42; 4:23-31; 12:11-12; 16:25

### **Praying #2**

#### Matthew 6:6

6 But you, when you pray, go into your room, and when you have shut your door, pray to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly."

- 1. Prayer is private communication with God. Genesis 20:1-7; 1 Kings 8:28-40; Psalm 55:16-17; Luke 18:1
- 2. God "sees in secret" 6:4, 6, 18

  He isn't impressed like a man would be!

  God sees all. Genesis 16:1-14;

  Psalm 33:13-15; John 12:44-45

### **Praying #3**

#### Matthew 6:5-8

- 7 "And when you pray, do not use vain repetitions as the heathen do. For they think that they will be heard for their many words. 8 Therefore do not be like them. For your Father knows the things you have need of before you ask Him."
- 1. "Heathen" one who "acts under a mask" or insincerely. Psalm 26:1-5; Galatians 2:11-14; Jeremiah 42:19-21; Matthew 15:1-9
- 2. Christians should NOT permit worship to follow the world's pattern!

#### **Praying #4**

### **Matthew 6:9-15**

"In this manner, therefore, pray: Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name. 10 Your kingdom come. Your will be done On earth as it is in heaven. 11 Give us this day our daily bread. 12 And forgive us our debts, As we forgive our debtors. 13 And do not lead us into temptation, But deliver us from the evil one. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever. Amen. 14 For if you forgive men their trespasses, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. 15 But if you do not forgive men their trespasses, neither will your Father forgive your trespasses.

#### 2. CONTRAST

**Praying #5** 

#### **Matthew 6:9-15**

- 1. To repeat "the Lord's prayer" is simply to quote Scripture, NOT offer a prayer.
- 2. To repeat the same words over and over, by rote, is the very practice of the "hypocrites" that Jesus is condemning!
- 3. God's "kingdom" has already come, and thus, this would be a meaningless phrase to use today! Colossians 1:13; Hebrews 12:28
- 4. To request "daily bread" requires "daily prayer"
- 5. God tempts NO ONE to sin! James 1:13-17
- 6. Asking God's forgiveness is useless if we will not forgive others' offenses against us.

Matthew 6:16-18 Fasting #1 "Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward. 17 But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, 18 so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly."

"Moreover, when you fast, do not be like the hypocrites, with a sad countenance. For they disfigure their faces that they may appear to men to be fasting. Assuredly, I say to you, they have their reward.

- 1. The issue is not "whether" but "when."
- 2. There never is a set date or time "when." Ezra 9:1-6; Nehemiah 1:1-4; Psalm 35:11-13; Daniel 9:1-3; Mark 9:29; Acts 10:30; 14:23; 1 Corinthians 7:15
- 3. "Fasting, like "giving" and "prayer" is personal between a Christian and God.
- 4. These 3 acts of devotion must NOT be associated with acts which call public attention to them.

#### 2. CONTRAST

- 17 But you, when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, 18 so that you do not appear to men to be fasting, but to your Father who is in the secret place; and your Father who sees in secret will reward you openly."
- 1. Disciples live differently from "hypocrites." Job 36:13-14; Psalm 26:3-8; Jeremiah 42:19-22; Matthew 15:1-9;

- 1. Two Masters: God or Mammon.
- 2. Impossible to try Luke 18:18-25
- 3. Loyalty is the issue James 1:5-8; 4:8
- 4. "Mammon" (Greek, mammona), money-god. Also in Luke 16:9,11,13
- 5.Don't Be Owned By Ownership!

#### Material Matters

Matthew 6:25 "THEREFORE I say to you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink; nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food

and the body more than clothing?

- 1. "Worry" = "anxiety" Philippians 4:6 \* "concern, planning ahead" Romans 1:11-13 ("longing"); Romans 15:23-24 ("longing"); 1 Thessalonians 2:17-18 ("desired," "longing")
- 2. "Life" = "soul" (Greek psyche) Matthew 10:28; 16:25-26
- 3. "Life" is "more than" not "other than"

# Material Matters Matthew 6:26-29

26 Look at the birds of the air, for they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them.

Are you not of more value than they?

- 1. Plural, God works for all, not just a particular individual or kind!
- 2. Birds are free to "fly" Genesis 1:20; "multiply" Genesis 1:22; and have "nests" Matthew 8:20; but not dominate mankind Genesis 1:26
- 3. Under Moses, used as poor's sacrifice instead of lamb Leviticus 5:7; 12:8; Luke 2:24

Matthew 6:27-29 Material Matter 27 Which of you by workying can add one Sowhy do you cubit to his stature? worry about clothing? Consider the lilies of the field how they grow they neither toil nor spin; 29 and yet I say to you that even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these.

- 1. What good does "anxiety do?"
  Then, why "worry?"
- 2. It's not that flowers grow, but "how!"
- 3. Elegance of human effort not equal!
  - 1 Kings 10:23; Revelation 17:3-6

## Matthew 6:30-32 **Material Matters** 30 Now Good so glothes the grass of the field, which today is, and tomorrow is thrown into the over, Will He hot much more clothe YOU, O you of little faith? 31 THEREFORE 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we wear?' 32 For after these things the Gentiles seek. For your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things.

- 1. "Anxiety" shows the size of faith Matthew 6:30; 8:26; 14:31; 16:8; 17:20
- 2. Don't practice religion like "others!" Matthew 6:2, 5, 7-8, 16, 19, 31-32

So Jesus answered and said, "Assuredly, I say to you, there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for My sake and the gospel's, who shall not receive a hundredfold now in this time-houses and brothers and sisters and mothers and children and lands, with persecutions -- and in the age to come, eternal life." Mark 10:29-30

2. Jesus seeks the lost Luke 19:10, but men must seek Him John 5:44; 6:20; Isaiah 55:6; Acts 15:14-17; 17:27

3 And why do you look at the speck in your brother's eye, but do not consider the plank in your own eye? 4 Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me remove the speck from your eye'; and look, a plank is in your own eye? 5 Hypocrite! First remove the plank from your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye."

- 1.Ours is simply a different "speck"!

- 2. No doubt, parallels can be drawn: "As a ring of gold in a swine's snout, So is a lovely woman who lacks discretion." Proverbs 11:22
- 3. Teaching the unteachable

Matthew 7:16-20

"You will know them by their fruits. Do men gather grapes from thornbushes or figs from thistles? 17 Even so, every good tree bears good fruit, but a bad tree bears bad fruit. 18 "A good tree cannot bear bad fruit, nor can a bad tree bear good fruit. 19 Every tree that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. 20 Therefore by their fruits you will know them."

1.Judging (vs.1) is NOT fruit inspection! 2.Judgment will NOT miss any bad tree! 3.What is preached is what is produced!

- 2."Not everyone" but some say "Lord, Lord" and then obey. Luke 6:46; 13:25
- 3."Does" = "obedience" Mark 3:35; 1
  John 2:17

"Many will say to Me in that day, 'Lord, Lord, have we not prophesied in Your name, cast out demons in Your name, and done many wonders in Your name?' 23 And then I will declare to them, 'I never knew you; depart from Me, you who practice lawlessness!"

- 1."Have we not" means they did not ask what pleased God, but assumed authority for their practices.

  Numbers 15:30-31; Psalm 19:13; Hebrews 10:26-27; 2 Peter 2:9-11
- 2."Lawlessness" = "self-willed" religion! I John 2:29; 3:4; Jeremiah 6:19-20; Malachi 1:6-14

#### Matthew 7:24-25

"Therefore whoever hears these sayings of Mine, and does them, I will liken him to a wise man who built his house on the rock:

25 and the rain descended, the floods came, and the winds blew and beat on that house;

and it did not fall, for it was founded on

the rock.

1."Weather-beaten"
isn't the same as
"defeated!"

2.The "wise" are those who obey Jesus Christ.

- 1. Everyone who heard, had the opportunity to be impressed with His "authority."
- 2. Nothing is said about anyone planning to hear any more.
- 3. Good decisions can be made as soon as good information is gathered.
