Proposition #1 7 PM, January 10, 2003, Trenton Church of Christ, 1714 College St, Trenton, TN

Rules For Public Debate January 10-11, 2003

- 1. Each debater will open his 1st speech with 3 minutes not charged to his speech time.
- 2. Each proposition will be carried for one (1) night.
- 3. Each evening's debate will consist of one 20-minute speech by each side followed by a 10-minute intermission; then another 20-minute speech by each side followed by a 10-minute intermission; then a 40-minute Question & Answer with questions from the audience.
- 4. A speaker may ask his opponent up to 3 questions, according to the time restraints.
- 5. During the Question & Answer session, audience members may ask questions from the floor with the stipulation that the first and third questions will first be addressed to the Affirmative speaker for the evening. After his reply of no more than 5 minutes, the opponent will be given up to 5 minutes to reply to the same question. The second and fourth questions from the audience will first be addressed to the Negative speaker for the evening with the same pattern to be followed as above.
- 6. Each speaker shall be responsible for his own video and/audio taping of the proceedings, with the understanding that this may be shared with each other to ensure each a usable copy.
- 7. There shall be no printed material pertaining to the debate subjects made available to the audience by either side.
- 8. There shall be no demonstrations (such as heckling or other willful disruptions) tolerated from the audience at any time.
- 9. A point of order may be called by a moderator or speaker for a breech of these rules, and the present speaker's time will be halted until the point of order is settled.

(It was a Gentlemen's agreement that both speakers would rely upon the King James Version of the Bible)

Polk's 1st Affirmative Notes

I. INTRODUCTION Comments

A. Defining the Proposition

RESOLVED: The Scriptures teach that a child of God, one who has been saved by the blood of Christ, can sin so as to be finally lost.

"Scriptures" = 66 inspired books of the Old and New Testaments

"teach" = impart knowledge by direct statements

or Scriptural conclusions

"child of God" = as defined in the proposition, "saved by the blood of

Christ" and therefore one who has changed spiritual state from darkness to light (**Colossians 1:13**)

"can" = the possibility exists

"so sin" = transgress God's Law, practice unrighteousness

"finally lost" = eternally condemned in Hell

B. Defining The Tasks

I am in complete affirmation of this proposition, believing this is precisely what the Scriptures teach. Jerry King has signed to negate this proposition, believing that I am in error on this doctrine.

His duty as the Negative in this discussion of the evening, will be to first, deal with my arguments and prove they are not what the Scriptures teach; and second, to present some argument that he feels sustains his opposite belief.

- He must NOT simply try to prove his case, for I am in the affirmative tonight, and he signed his commitment to be in the negative;
- He must NOT array Scripture against Scripture, for that is the work of the infidel and agnostic, and I firmly believe that the Bible does not contradict itself;
- He must NOT deal with other subjects which may be of interest but are of no value to understanding the proposition this evening;
- He must NOT mis-use this opportunity and abuse your sincere interest in this subject by "testifying or witnessing" to his Baptist Church, for the signed statement is over what "the Scriptures teach."

C. CHART: WHAT IS THE ISSUE BETWEEN US

WE ARE NOT DISCUSSING:

- Whether the Church of Christ OR the Baptist Church is right;
- Any other doctrine of either church than "once-saved-always-saved;"
- What God can do. The Negative cannot produce passages dealing with what God does in Heaven, and ignore the passages I produce which speak of man's God-given duties to remain faithful;

WE DO NOT HAVE AN ISSUE OVER:

- Whether a child of God, Believer, Faithful, Disciple, etc. shall be saved;
- Whether faith saves; a person is saved by his/her own righteousness;
- Whether Christians may now "have eternal life" in some sense.

CF 1 John 1:1-3: "That which was from the beginning, which we have heard, which we have seen with our eyes, which we have looked upon, and our hands have handled, of the Word of life; 2 (For the life was manifested, and we have seen it, and bear witness, and shew unto you that eternal life, which was with the Father, and was manifested unto us;) 3 That which we have seen and heard declare we unto you, that ye also may have fellowship with us: and truly our fellowship is with the Father, and with his Son Jesus Christ."

THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN US IS THAT:

I maintain, however, that it is a conditional promise of God that will be ultimately realized.

1 John 2:24-25: "Let that therefore abide in you, which ye have heard from the beginning. If that which ye have heard from the beginning shall remain in you, ye also shall continue in the Son, and in the Father. 25 And this is the promise that he hath promised us, even eternal life."

Jerry King's doctrine gives all of eternal life unconditionally to the Believer at the split second of faith, and that there is nothing that can be done to affect that!

I maintain that, God promises eternal life conditionally, and that while on earth, the believer can lost his/her belief and change the destiny of the soul in eternity.

Jesus' Deity Speaks Of Future As Present

John 3:36 "He that believeth on the Son **hath** everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abideth on him."

John 6:47 "Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me hath everlasting life."

John 6:54 "Whoso eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, **hath** eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day."

[Question: Did Those Who Believed In Jesus Before He Was Crucified Receive Eternal Life Without His Cross?]

The past tense is used by Jesus of future events, to emphasize the certainty of their outcome. Consider the following examples:

When Were "All Things" Put Under Jesus?

"The Father loveth the Son, and hath given all things into his hand."

(John 3:35).

- But the writer to the Hebrews explicitly states, "But now we see not yet all things put under him." (Hebrews 2:8).
- "For he hath put all things under his feet. But when he saith all things are put under him, it is manifest that he is excepted, which did put all things under him." (1 Corinthians 15:27)

When Did Jesus "Finish" His Work On Earth?
"I have finished the work which thou gavest me to do."

(John 17:4).

• But Jesus had yet to die "for our sins according to the Scriptures." (1 Corinthians 15:3).

It Denies Jesus' Deity To Make "Everlasting Life" Present In Passages Like These, As King's Doctrine Does!

CHRISTIANS MAY SHRINK TO DAMNATION

Hebrews 10:36-39: "For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise.

37 For yet a little while, and he that shall come will come, and will not tarry. 38 Now the just shall live by faith: but if any man draws back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him. 39 But we are not of them who draw back unto perdition; but of them that believe to the saving of the soul."

- "Perdition" [Greek, άρωλεία] "consists in the loss of eternal life, eternal misery" (*Thayer's Greek Lexicon*, p. 71) and is in:
- **2 Peter 3:7** "But the heavens and the earth, which are now, by the same word are kept in store, reserved unto fire against the day of judgment and **perdition** of ungodly men."
- **2 Peter 3:16** "As also in all his epistles, speaking in them of these things; in which are some things hard to be understood, which they that are unlearned and unstable wrest, as they do also the other scriptures, unto their own **destruction**."

NEGATIVE CHART #1

What Sin(s) Can A Child Of God Commit And Be Saved?

1. Calling a brother "Thou fool"?

Matthew 5:22 "But I say unto you, That whosoever is angry with his brother without a cause shall be in danger of the judgment: and whosoever shall say to his brother, "Raca," shall be in danger of the council: but whosoever shall say, "Thou fool," shall be in danger of hell fire."

2. Defiling practices?

Matthew 15:19 "For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies: these are the things which defile a man: but to eat with unwashen hands defileth not a man."

3. Works of the flesh?

Galatians 5:19-21

"Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness, 20 Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, 21 Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God."

Does King Preach Purgatory For Sinning Christians?

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NEGATIVE CHART #2

If King's Doctrine Is What Is Taught In I John 3:9 He Will Sustain It With Damning Consequences!

I. He Must Say: "God disciplines/punishes the child of God on earth, but not forever in Hell."

Then A Child Of God Can Walk In Darkness On Earth But Not Forever

1 John 1:6: "If we say that we have fellowship with him,
and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth."

II. OR He Must Say: "It is impossible for a child of God to sin."

Then The Child Of God Is A Liar!

1 John 1:8: "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us."

III. OR He Must Say: "The child of God (spirit) cannot sin, but the body (flesh) does."

Then The Spirit Cannot Confess Christ Or Sin!

1 John 1:9: "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us [our] sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness."

IV. OR He Must Say: "God does not count a child of God's sins."

Then God Is A Liar!

1 John 1:10: "If we say that we have not sinned, we make him a liar, and his word is not in us."

1 John 3:9 CANNOT TEACH THAT ONCE A PERSON BECOMES A "CHILD OF GOD," THERE IS NO SIN IN HIS/HER LIFE ON EARTH, EVER, AGAIN (A.K.A. "ONCE SAVED, ALWAYS SAVED"), FOR THEN IT CONTRADICTS 1 JOHN 1!

1 John 3:6-10: "[1] Whosoever abideth in Him sinneth not: whosoever sinneth hath not seen Him, neither known Him. Little children, let no man deceive you: he that doeth righteousness is righteous, even as He is righteous. [2] He that committeth sin is of the devil; for the devil sinneth from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might destroy the works of the devil. [3] Whosoever is born of God doth not commit sin; for His seed remaineth in him: and [4] he cannot sin, because he is born of God. In this the children of God are manifest, and the children of the devil: [5] whosoever doeth not righteousness is not of God, neither he that loveth not his brother."

NOTE: [1] present, constant action of abiding (verse 6 says the same as verse 9); [2] present, constant action of sinning; [3] a "child of God" does not choose to commit sin inconsistent with the "seed" (a.k.a. God's Word) in him/her; [4] "cannot" continuously commit sin "because" (for the reason) it is inconsistent with being "a child of God;" [5] present, constant action of righteousness

ETERNAL LIFE CANNOT BE FULLY CLAIMED "ON EARTH"

- I. Eternal Life Is A Promise
 - 1 John 2:25: "And this is the promise that He hath promised us, even eternal life"
- II. Eternal Life Is A Hope
 - Titus 1:1-2: "Paul, a servant of God, and an apostle of Jesus Christ, according to the faith of God's elect, and the acknowledging of the truth which is after godliness;

 2 In hope of eternal life, which God, that cannot lie, promised before the world began"
 - Titus 3:7 "That being justified by His grace, we should be made heirs according to the hope of eternal life."
- III. Hope Has Not Been Seen Or Completely Realized

Romans 8:24-25: "For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man seeth, why doth he yet hope for? 25 But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it."

- IV. Christian Armor Includes A Helmet Of Hope
 - Ephesians 6:17: "And take the helmet of salvation"

 1 Thessalonians 5:8: "For a helmet the hope of salvation"
- V. Eternal Life Is Ultimately A Future Experience

Rom. 13:11: "... for now is our salvation nearer than when we believed."

How can it be "nearer" if we already have it?

- Heb. 1:14: "Angels are "ministering spirits, sent forth to minister for them who shall be heirs of salvation."

 An heir does not presently possess the inheritance.
 - 1 Peter 1:4-5: "To an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you, 5 Who are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time." A Christian's inheritance is "in heaven" NOT on earth.

Jesus' Parable Of The Sower Teaches That Believers Can "Fall Away"

Matthew 13:20-21: "But he that received the seed into stony places, the same is he that heareth the word, and anon with joy receiveth it; 21 Yet hath he not root in himself, but dureth for a while: for when tribulation or persecution ariseth because of the word, by and by he is offended."

Mark 4:16-17: "And these are they likewise which are sown on stony ground; who, when they have heard the word, immediately receive it with gladness; 17 And have no root in themselves, and so endure but for a time: afterward, when affliction or persecution ariseth for the word's sake, immediately they are offended."

Luke 8:13: "They on the rock are they, which, when they hear, receive the word with joy; and these have no root, which for a while believe, and in time of temptation fall away."

"Fall away" [Greek, aφίσταμι] is also used in:

- **1 Timothy 4:1:** "Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall **depart from** the faith, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils"
- 1 Timothy 6:5: "Perverse disputings of men of corrupt minds, and destitute of the truth, supposing that gain is godliness: from such withdraw thyself."

NEGATIVE CHART #5

If Eternal Salvation Occurs With "Instant Faith," Then King Must Account For These Scriptures:

- Mark 10:30: "But he shall receive an hundredfold now in this time, houses, and brethren, and sisters, and mothers, and children, and lands, with persecutions; and in the world to come eternal life."
- 2. Romans 6:22: "But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life."
- 3. 1 Timothy 4:8: "godliness is profitable unto all things, having promise of the life that now is, and of that which is to come."
